The Effect Of Sin To "ME?"

If we were to take some surveys from different folks as to what really is sin and whether it is that bad, there is no doubt that we would get a variety of opinions in response. However if we really want truth, we look to the only Being that does know; that is God. He is the only One Who can definitively teach us what sin is and the effect that it has upon His creation. dvh

Sin Is A ROBBER (Steals, Kills & Destroys)

Reading in John 10:10 (NKJV), The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly. The biggest thief is the one of souls, Satan. He uses false teachers and temptation to STEAL, KILL & DESTROY ...

- ⇒ Our relationship with God (Gen 3; Isa. 59:1,2; Jam. 4:4)
- ⇒ The blessings God wants to give us (i.e., acceptance, forgiveness, peace, joy, hope, inheritance ... cf. Ep. 1:3-12)
- ⇒ Our relationships (e.g., family, friends, etc. 1 Jn 1:7; Amos 3:3)
- ⇒ Our very souls (Ez. 18:4,20; Re. 21:8)

Sin robs us of everything dearest in this world. Those who live in sin may not even realize how much they missed out upon having!

SIN Is A Detestable FILTH & STAIN (Corrupts & Defiles)

Picture in your mind a wedding that is about to take place and the bride is dressed in all her glory. Before the traditional march down the aisle, an attendant spills blackberry punch down the front of her dress. It is a stain that won't come out and it is ruined...what a predicament...? Unlike the illustration (has heartbreaking it may be the bride) the stain of sin, is that it is upon the soul with an eternal consequences. We may illustrate with *Matthew 15:18-20 (NKJV)* 18 *But those things which proceed out of the mouth come from the heart, and they defile a man. 19 For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies. 20 These are the things which defile a man, but to eat with unwashed hands does not defile a man."*

Yes, Sin corrupts and defiles the inner man, the soul (1 Co. 6:9-11, 18-20. Ep. 5:3-6; etc.) It is there and one cannot stand before God with soul stained in sin. He must be cleansed to be accepted of God (Isa. 1:16-20; Ps. 51:7; Rev. 7:14; 21:27). This is a "heart" stain that defiles our conscience with guilt, and it CAN'T be removed except by the blood of Christ through an obedient faith (Heb. 9:11-14; 10:22; 1 Pet. 1:22; 3:21). No heart stained in sin can be used by God or have fellowship with God.

SIN Is A Cruel MASTER (Enslaves, Controls & Burdens)

Jesus made this very clear (*John 8:34-36 (NKJV)*) 34 *Jesus answered them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, whoever commits sin is a slave of sin. 35 And a slave does not abide in the house forever, but a son abides forever. 36 Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed.*

Clearly, sins effect is that sinners are in bondage to sin. God's word states this directly. As in *Proverbs 5:22 (NKJV)* 22 *His own iniquities entrap the wicked man, And he is caught in the cords of his sin. Or in Romans 6:16 (NKJV)* 16 *Do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin leading to death, or of obedience leading to righteousness? Or in, Romans 7:14 (NKJV)* 14 *For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am carnal, sold under sin. And Romans 7:24-25 (NKJV)* 24 *O wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this*

body of death? 25 I thank God – through Jesus Christ our Lord! ...

SIN Is A Darkness That BLINDS The Mind (Will Not See)

The Bible describes walking in sin as "walking in darkness" (1 Jn 1:6; Ps. 82:5; Pr. 2:13; Is. 59:9, 10; Jer. 23:12). More, those who walk in darkness do not understand where they are going (Jn 12:35; 1 Jn 2:9-11). In applying this metaphor spiritually, those who walk in sin, whether due to deception or ignorance, do not understand why they have such trouble in life (Prov. 4:19; Jn 11:10). That is one horrible effect of sin upon a person. And he can't see it!

We are to walk in the light (truth) and expose darkness (Eph. 5:8-14). As John noted, *John 3:19-20 (NKJV)* 19 *And this is the condemnation, that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. 20 For everyone practicing evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed. Paul sated it this way, Romans 1:21-22 (NKJV)* 21 *because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened. 22 Professing to be wise, they became fools, Matthew noted, 13:15 (NKJV)* 15 *For the hearts of this people have grown dull. Their ears are hard of hearing, And their eyes they have closed, Lest they should see with their eyes and hear with their ears, Lest they should understand with their hearts and turn, So that I should heal them.'*

None are more blind than those who do not know they are blind.

SIN IS A Deadly Spiritual DISEASE (Destroys & Kills)

Leprosy served as a vivid type or figure of sin in the Bible (Ps 51:7; 2 Ki 5:1, 7, 10, 13, 14). Consider some of the comparisons:

- ⇒ Sin, like leprosy in Bible times, is incurable by man. (2 Kings 5:7)
- ⇒ Sin, like leprosy, is loathsome & defiling. (Lev. 13:2,3)
- ⇒ Sin, like leprosy, causes separation (Le. 13:44-46)
- ⇒ Sin, like leprosy, unless cured - causes death. (2 Chron. 26:21)

Jesus was able to miraculously heal leprosy, and other diseases (The blind, lame, lepers, deaf; the dead are raised - Mat 11:4,5). As this demonstrated His Deity, it also pointed to His
